



GUAM COMPREHENSIVE CANCER CONTROL (CCC) AWARDS



Application for 2016 Spirit of Collaboration Award

A united front against cancer can tackle major issues—like better access to quality care, survivorship, health disparities, and quality of life—that are too broad and cross-cutting for any one organization to confront alone. The Guam CCC Coalition is a diverse group of public and private sector stakeholders and individuals who work collaboratively to reduce the burden of cancer and eliminate gaps in cancer services in Guam. The success of the CCC Coalition depends on the commitment and involvement of a broad spectrum of organizations and partners who are willing to share their expertise, resources and experiences with one another.

The **Spirit of Collaboration Award** is presented to organizations that demonstrate exemplary collaborative efforts in the fight against cancer. Collaboration is defined as the act of working together to achieve something. Collaboration can occur internally within one organization (between two or more programs or services) or it can be between two or more different organizations. Nominees *do not* have to be members of the CCC Coalition.

Nomination and Selection Process

- Anyone from the public is eligible to submit nominations. The nomination form must be signed by the nominator.
- The nominee's contributions or achievements *in the fight against cancer, such as prevention, screening and early detection, data and policy initiatives*, must be for activities conducted on Guam. Nominees *do not* have to be members of the CCC Coalition.
- For the 2016 Awards, eligible activities must have commenced from January 2015 to the present. Ongoing activities are acceptable. Activities *do not* have to be endorsed or affiliated with the CCC Coalition to be eligible for nomination.
- Nominations will be reviewed by an anonymous awards committee.
- Award winners will be announced at the 2017 Annual Cancer Retreat on January 13, 2017 (tentative), where award winners will receive a commemorative plaque and certificates.

Deadline for Submission is at 5:00p.m. on October 31, 2016 (Monday).
